You work for the Bank of Tawara. The bank sends all spreadsheets containing recent transactions in an encrypted form. You will decrypt a spreadsheet which holds 76 transactions over a 5-day period for one client. Each transaction on the completed spreadsheet must display only the date, bank sort code, account number, credit and debit columns.

You must use the most efficient methods and all work must be of a professional standard and suit this business context. All documents must fit on a single portrait page wide when printed on A4 paper with text at least 12 points high. Display all currency values in dollars with 2 decimal places.

- 1 Using suitable spreadsheet software, open and examine the data in the file **186encrypted.csv**

Evidence 1

Save this as a **spreadsheet** called **decrypt_** followed by your Centre number_ then your candidate number, for example: decrypt_ZZ999_9999

Insert 4 new rows at the top of the spreadsheet and place the contents of **186title.csv** into cells B2:L3.

Merge cells B2:L2 into a single cell formatted as a title in (at least) a 24 point sans serif font. [4]

- 2 For each transaction use formulae to extract:

- the first digit and place this in the *Transmitted check digit* column
- the next 6 digits and display these as the *Bank sort code*,
for example if the digits are 240912 the bank sort code would be displayed as 24-09-12
- the next 9 digits and display these as a 9-digit *Account number*
- the next 8 digits and display these in the *Date digits* column
- the next character and display this in the *Transaction* column
- any other digits and place these in the *Working 2* column. [18]

- 3 Place formulae in column C to display the date of each transaction. The date is held in column B as digits in the form ddmmyyyy. Display this date so that if the cell in column B contains 12012018 the date should be displayed as 12 January 2018 [12]

- 4 Place formulae in the *Calculated check digit* column to calculate a single digit checksum (by adding all the digits in the account number column and extracting the last digit from this total). [7]

- 5 Place formulae in the *Working 1* column to compare the Transmitted and Calculated check digits. If the two data items for each transaction do not match, indicate that there is an error. Test the formula for each transaction and correct the *Transmitted check digit* for that row. [3]

- 6 Evaluate the use of this function and the method of correction used in question 5. [6]

Evidence 2

Place your evaluation in a new document saved as **Evidence_** followed by your Centre number_ then your candidate number, for example: Evidence_ZZ999_9999

- 7 Automatically display the value of each transaction in either the *credit* or *debit* column. The *Transaction* column must be used and the value held in the *Working 2* column is the value of each transaction in cents (there are 100 cents in a dollar). The letters C and D in the *Transaction* column represent Credit and Debit. [4]

- 8 Replace the text <a> and with appropriate dates and apply appropriate formatting to your spreadsheet. [7]

Save your spreadsheet.

- 9 Explain, in no more than 200 words, what encryption is and why banks use encrypted data. [5]

- 10 Create a new **spreadsheet** that looks like this:

- 11 In cell B4 restrict the data entry so that only a date between the 1 January 2018 and today's date can be entered. Display an appropriate error message if incorrect data is entered. [4]

Smooth transition into the video file **186MCP.wmv**

Time 22 seconds:

Take a still image from the last frame of the video clip and set this as a background image. Display appropriate credits on the right of the screen for 12 seconds. Include your name, Centre number, candidate number and the advertising slogan in the credits.

End

Extract the last 34 seconds of the file **186sound.mp3** and add this to the video clip, so that it plays alongside the existing soundtrack. [35]
